This is a 4-day course instructed by two world-renowned experts in the areas of BUGS AND BONES. The class brings together these two topics — ENTOMOLOGY AND ANTHROPOLOGY — as they often cross over and supplement one and other in regard to the scientific information they can provide to an investigation. This class is designed as an introduction to these concepts and is geared towards Crime Scene Responders, Medical Examiners, Coroners, Death Investigators, Detectives, Forensic Nurses, Attorneys, and Students seeking a greater understanding of the forensic use of BUGS AND BONES.

Participating students will be presented information on proper scene documentation (photography and measurements); documentation of climate, weather, and environmental conditions; procedural steps in collection and documentation of BUGS AND BONES; the impact of entomology and anthropology on an investigation; and case examples by the instructors. HANDS-ON ACTIVITIES will occupy 1/2 of the class time.

Additional Information:

Enrollment limited to thirty (30) students, early enrollment is recommended. Casual attire is suggested.
